PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Membership in WASH has held at a steady level of between 140 and 150 members for many years. It normally fluctuates almost every day as memberships expire and are renewed, which implies we also have a uniform loss of members and acquisition of new members since our overall membership remains fairly constant.

Our membership covers the range of ages, although we're heavily weighted towards older members. Since one of our goals is to serve the greater Sacramento area through art and art education, we're currently undertaking an effort to broaden our member's age distribution (and better meet our service goal) by introducing WASH to new, younger members.

Some of the ideas we're exploring to bring in younger members is to directly approach younger artists, principally in area colleges, and to offer incentives to them such as reduced membership fees, lower art show entry fees, and shows that feature aspiring new artists (regardless of membership status).

We'll be checking with the Fine Arts Center and NCA to align with their policies and desires to join us in this endeavor.

I really like this approach and am interested in hearing from our members regarding any ideas you may have that would be helpful. Are we being too parochial in our thinking; should we create something for kids, for example? Perhaps we could mix chalk with water and paint sidewalks to generate interest.
